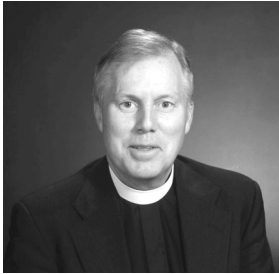

News from the Rector



Dear Friends,

Holy Week and the Easter Triduum,
Maundy Thursday, Good Friday,



Easter, mark the holiest celebration in our Christian calendar.

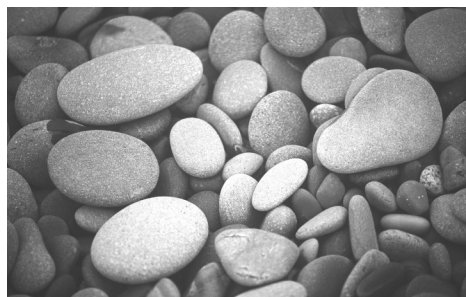
For at least 1500 years, the Church has devoted itself to this sacred observance, following Jesus in his last hours of his passion, death, and joyful resurrection. Each year, we at St. Mary's are invited to follow in this tradition as we gather together to celebrate Holy Week.

It begins on Palm Sunday, April 17th, when we reenact Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem with palms and shouts of hosanna. At 10 am that day, we gather at Sturgis Library and make our own procession down 6A, into the church to hear the Passion, empowered to walk with Jesus "in the way of his suffering". On Maundy Thursday, we remember our Lord's Last Supper, as we celebrate the Eucharist, and reenact Jesus' washing of his disciples' feet, when we strip the altar, and observe our watch throughout the hours of that night. On Good Friday, we will have our first service at 12 noon, when we observe the liturgy of the Stations of the Cross, marking the journey Jesus took through Jerusalem as he was lead to his crucifixion. At 5 pm that evening, there will be a children's Good Friday service, and at 7:30 pm, we will observe our Good Friday liturgy with our brothers and sisters from West Parish, First Baptist in Hyannis, and First Lutheran Church. Then, at 5 pm on Saturday, the 23rd, we will have our first celebration of Easter in our Great Easter Vigil, followed by a reception in the parish hall. And on Easter Day, we will celebrate two festival Eucharists at 9 and 11 am, with special music by our choir and guest instrumentalists.

We do hope you will be able to join us in these sacred observances this year, and that the Passion and Resurrection of Jesus will give you a renewed sense of hope, peace, and joy in your lives.

From the Director of Family Ministries

As I write this, I am pondering the call of Lent to remember the Passion of Jesus as we work our way toward our Easter miracle. Lent is such a long period of time, but I realize that this is not without cause. To really experience the suffering of Jesus, the suffering of others and our own suffering, we need time. When we have had a loss or are recovering from something devastating in our lives, it is tempting to rush through suffering and avoid the feelings it brings. We want to, as it has often been said, get to the joy of Easter Sunday without experiencing the sorrow of Holy Week. If then, there is one thing I would say to encourage each of you this Lenten season, it would be this: be still.



Understand the purpose of remaining in the sorrow of this time of Lent and Holy Week. Don't put those Easter decorations up quite yet! Let the alleluias stay hidden for the time being and allow yourself to just remain with the story of Jesus, his journey to the cross, his own suffering and the suffering of a God who loved us enough to come to us and show us the way home. If you can remain in this time of Lent, the Easter morning statement, "He is not here.", will be as miraculous to you this Easter as it was to Mary and the disciples on that first Resurrection Sunday.

But of course this is the newsletter for the FULL month, so even as I say these words, I need to remind you of what happens at the end of the story! We realize Easter Sunday is at the end of April Vacation week and so we do hope we'll see many of you here on this special day. Here's the schedule for those who will be in town for the weekend:

Easter Sunday, April 24, 10:00 am, Family Ministries Coffee Hour and Easter Egg Hunt. Our Easter Liturgies are at 9:00 and 11:00 am today, so which ever you choose to attend, this special coffee hour is right in between! Join us for a great time of coffee and juice and Easter treats. The kids will participate in an Easter Egg hunt and bring out the 'Alleluias' that have been hidden away during Lent!

—There will be no Church School on Easter Sunday, but nursery care is available for infants through 3 year olds at both services.

—Please remember to bring your "Hope Chest" on April 24, Easter Sunday, to add to the St Mary's contribution to Episcopal Relief and Development's on-going work. Envelopes for donation of checks and additional boxes are still in the Sunroom.

Most of us know families who do not have a church home right now. I wonder if each of us might consider inviting a family or two to come to our Coffee Hour and Easter Egg Hunt? It would be a great way to introduce them to our parish and the opportunities for their children to learn about the love of God.

God's deep peace to each of you as you continue on the Lenten journey.

Music for Holy Week and Easter

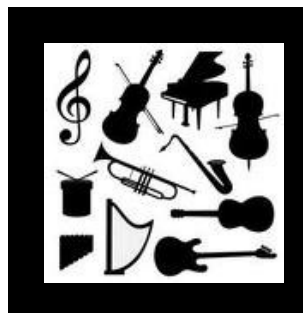

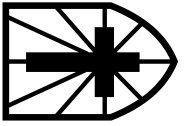
