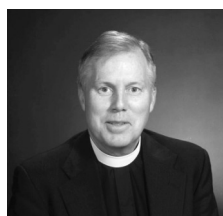

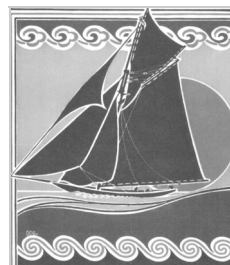

What an amazing statement. Ms. Clark, who is a motivational speaker and author, has summarized a major set of truths in this simple statement. The first is *life is change*, that everything changes in life. Biologically we would be atrophied or dead with out the changes everyday in our bodies...I don't mean the changes of aging or illness, but the renewal of our bodies at the cellular level keep us functioning and healthy every day, even if we aren't feeling that way. Personal change, corporate change, community change, church change happens constantly, leaving us unsteady on our feet. The second is that growth is *absolutely optional*. We have the choice, the free will, as it were to wander through life and not allow the events around us to affect us, to inform us, to deeply move and ultimately change us OR we can embrace the new and understand the opportunities presented to us and be moved, touched and changed on a deep spiritual level. Finally *choose wisely*...the phrase that is woven through the story of God's people and the church over the centuries. If we choose to embrace change, we actively choose to grow. It is that simple.

I think of this phrase for two reasons. The first, perhaps most obvious is that as you know by now, I am leaving my position at Saint Mary's and returning to Chicago, where I lived for many years while I attended seminary. It is at the same time a familiar terrain; old colleagues and friends and two of my adult children there all excited about my return; and also new and unknown landscape; new work and new relationships, and a severe lack of ocean access. I have chosen to embrace both of these...old and new...and to envision a time of deep spiritual growth for myself. The second reason this phrase moves me is thinking about the Christian Church and the season of Pentecost. Without the understanding that it was time to move from their safe group in the upper room and out into the unknown of the 1st Century Palestinian world, the Church would not have been created, the Gentiles (you and me) would not have heard the Good News of the Gospel. The disciples felt the breath of the Spirit of God on their faces that day and went forward, not knowing what would be, but knowing they should. They chose wisely.

So, in my last words in this format to you, I beseech you each as individuals and all as a group to do the same! To look ahead with anticipation at what the future will bring you as persons seeking spiritual growth, families teaching their children the wondrous stories of God's love and a parish sharing that love with those inside and outside of the parish walls. There is a deep fountain of God's pure thirst quenching water here, and as I had the opportunity to say at our Church School Celebration, drink your own fill and then share this with another who thirsts for the love of God.

My deep gratitude to the staff and volunteers who were so generous with their time and talents in our Family Ministry program. It has grown and flourished because of you and you will continue this vital work in the parish. There will be a change of leadership, but choose to grow with it and your choice will be wise indeed.

Stewardship 2012: Grace and Gratitude

This is the third in a series of brief articles composed by the various clergy who worship and serve at Saint Mary's. Addressing a particular parable or event from Our Lord's ministry, they are intended to heighten our understanding of the spiritual dimensions of stewardship.

Jesus' well-known Parable of the Talents appears both in Matthew and Luke's Gospel. It is interesting that Matthew (25:14-30) places his parable of the Talents AFTER Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem (on Palm Sunday) while Luke places his version (19:12-27) just BEFORE Jesus' entry into the great city.

I haven't quite figured out why this different timing, but the Parable is nevertheless a **tale about stewardship**--taking care of things (money in particular)--and essentially it is about "making a response" to the Master.

First, I would like to clear away some of the interpretations about stewardship that we have inherited, for stewardship, as a term and concept, is much like a magnet that attracts to itself various iron filings which can congest its central meaning.

We have all heard the bromide: "Stewardship is the main work of the Church" and so it is, but what does that mean? -- caring, giving service to God and humankind, taking good care of our means, sharing our resources, expressing love and compassion, peace-making, community-building, reconciliation, environmental responsibility? YES, that's all about stewardship.

But essentially, stewardship is the response you and I make to the Master's call and challenge to be partners with God. The responsibility assigned the servants in the Parable gave each of them an **obligation to respond**, faithfully, creatively, sacrificially, prudently, or otherwise.

Realize that God our Father has already made the first move and has taken the initiative as Giver and Provider. God has moved out to us in trust and with assurance that we are capable, that we are gifted--each one of us--to be a steward. Our role is to receive God's trust, God's empowerment and to respond as best we can.

We are reminded of Saint Paul's words in Romans 5:8.

"God shows his love for us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us."

And there is Saint Peter's awesome remark in his First Epistle 2:9-10:

"But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people... Once you were no people but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy but now you have received mercy."

And so our life here is not so much about success or aggrandizement, achievement but of making a faithful response or accounting of ourselves before the Lord who has given us so much and continues to endow His Church

with blessings from above, for use for the common good. Thanks-giving overshadows guilt or gotta giving each and every time as long as you and I are faithful to what we are being called to be and to do.

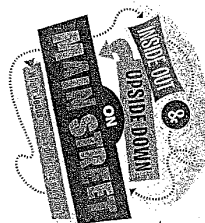
