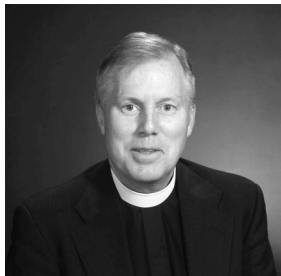

## From the Director of Family Ministries



“What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, ‘Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill,’ and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. But someone will say, ‘You have faith and I have works.’ Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith. For just as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is also dead”.

*The Epistle of St. James 2:14-18, 26*

The apostle James reminds us of a very important aspect of our identities as followers of Jesus. Since we have been redeemed by the Grace of God, our responsibility as Children of God is to behave as if this matters. The phrase “faith without works is dead” is a sobering one. We are not asked to earn our place in the Kingdom of God, but our identity as Children of God should *form* and *inform* the way we care for our parish, our community and our world. With this knowledge, how can we help our children and families develop this sense of identity as both “hearers and doers” of the word of God? I would offer that the most important thing we can do is to model this for them. Our parish is indeed living out this principle every day through its work with Days and Overnights of Hospitality, local and global outreach projects, hosting community support groups, our presence in nursing homes and support of Episcopal Relief and Development.

We have a number of opportunities in the summer and beyond, that offer the opportunity to be both “hearers and doers” of the gospel message. Please consider participating in some way!

**Sunday, June 12** we will celebrate **Children’s Sunday** at the 10:00 service. This also happens to be Pentecost Sunday, so come expecting lots of color and celebration! In this service, we honor our children, our teachers, nursery staff and volunteers and the mission of the Family Ministries program.

**Thursday evenings in July**, we will sponsor our own **Vacation Bible School** with the theme, **“We Are God’s Hands!”** We will explore together some of the Saints of the Church, both early and contemporary, and how they lived out the gospel call to love our neighbors as ourselves. Each evening we will gather for supper at 5:00 pm, and then begin our program with songs, games, arts and crafts, missions moments and some pretty great stories of the Saints of God. We welcome volunteers to help us prepare supper and those to help lead our activities. See next page for more details!

Finally, we continue preliminary discussions about creating a weekly worship service in Hyannis for all those who are drawn to join us. We will share more details as they are available, but prayerfully consider what part you might play in this important developing outreach ministry to folks who may not feel worship inside a church is an option for them.

So, I will leave you with this challenge...how will you, young or old, parent or single person, add your hands to the work at Saint Mary’s? If someone describes this church to a friend or neighbor, would they be able to say, “those are hearers and doers of the gospel”? If we take our faith and our call as Children of God seriously, this will be our singular mission.

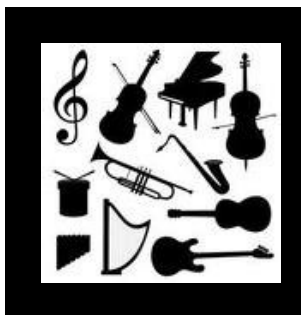
## SAINT MARY'S 2011 SUMMER MUSIC CAMP

## NOTES FROM THE GARDEN

As many of you are aware, this past fall we planted a large Sugar Maple tree in memory of Jim Carlaw. It is sited at the very **top of the Meadow**, to the left of the Stone Wall and to the right of the Memorial Garden. The area was completely covered with a variety of invasive species and, with the help of our good committee members and the Barnstable volunteers, we were able to clear it for planting. It is a work in progress! We have planted six Delaware Azaleas and four white rhododendrons around the tree. On the next workday, we plan to prepare the area between the tree and the plantings so that we can plant grass in that space. That will create a lovely green area and enable persons to walk around the tree and the Memorial Stone. (Many of these plants have been given as Memorial/Thanksgiving gifts and some are still available. The list is on the Bulletin Board.) The challenge in this space, as in the entire garden, is to keep the invasive species under control.

In the **Memorial Garden**, small pots of pansies have been placed around the garden and a large white rhododendron has been planted behind the Urn, replacing a tree that had died. The rhododendron is in memory of Norm Thornton's wife. All such gifts are recorded in the Memorial Book located in the Narthex.

Over the next few weeks, the **fence in the Herb Garden** will be taken apart and repaired. The lovely gate will be restored and attached to the fence at the end of the Herb Garden. That work also includes replacing the rotted wood in the **Lambert Garden**. When the work is complete, our good Barnstable young men will paint the fences.

The **Rock Wall** surrounding the Rock Garden has gradually deteriorated for a variety of reasons. Last week's workday saw the beginning of that restoration.

The **walkway** to the kitchen from the parking lot was completed this spring. The stones have been placed in the muddy area between the Boardwalk and the Daffodil Meadow. Other stones have been placed around the garden in spots that can be muddy and thus slippery.

**Five forsythias** have been planted along the Vista area, a request of some of the Daffodil tea ladies. They are in a spot where they will be able to grow naturally and I have no doubt that they will be magnificent by Teatime, 2012! There are two more planted just to the right of the St. Francis shrine.

The above notes are but a snapshot of the on going work in our garden. Our next workday is **June 8 at 8:30** and you are all invited to come and join us. Additionally, if any of you would be willing to take responsibility for a small or large area of the garden, please give me a call.

**Please put June 5 on your calendars for our Annual Rogation Sunday event. Wear your gardening clothes to church and come help us weed, plant, and mulch.**

## Stewardship 2012

### LOVE LIFTED ME

*He entered Jericho and was passing through it. A man was there named Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was rich. He was trying to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to see him, because he was going to pass that way. When Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down; for I must stay at your house today." So he hurried down and was happy to welcome him. All who saw it began to grumble and said, "He has gone to be the guest of one who is a sinner." Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Look, half of my possessions, Lord, I will give to the poor; and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much." Then Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he too is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost. Luke 19: 1 – 10*



Rarely do we suppose the rich to be "down and outers." Zacchaeus exposes that myth big time. A perceived wealthy thief and community outcast, he needed someone who cared about folks like him. He had heard that this Jesus might just be that kind of person. Gracefully ("... hurry and come down, for I must stay at your house today") Jesus proves him right. Gratefully ("... he hurried down and was happy to welcome him.") Zacchaeus becomes a bountiful giver. Whenever I reflect on this biblical story, the power of an old camp-meeting song never fails to come to mind: "Love Lifted Me." "... when nothing else would do, LOVE ... LIF-TED ME." Can you hear Jericho's tax man singing a new song?

Grace, God's love directed toward us, and our subsequent expressions of gratitude, are at the very heart of this relational faith we share in the church. With God, we commune, we pray, we complain-question-doubt, we journey to make better sense of who and whose we are. "God help us" is frequently on our lips. Our "thank you's" follow often and repeatedly. God knows and is responding before we stop conversing. When we pause in silence we know again the divine assurances.

What, then, is there to do? In gratitude we try to give back to others some of the joy, love and relief we experience as pilgrims of the cross. As stewards of God's loving grace, we try to be there for others in season and out, regardless of their station in life. We know truly that it is God who lifts us, inspires us, and fulfills us along the broad and narrow ways of this mortal life. In the camp song, and in the great Easter love story of salvation, our part is then to join the faithful chorus: "with all that I am, and with all that I have." With a grateful generosity like Zacchaeus's, we welcome all the opportunities to give, which is actually to share what we've been given. All that we have is from the source of all that is, by whatever measure we've been blest to manage. Gladly, then, we partake of the further blessing of sharing God's gifts. In so doing we become not only the daughters and sons of Abraham, but also co-inheritors with our Lord in a kingdom prepared for all. For as we know, in God's abundant kingdom, there are no outsiders; the lost are and will always be found. So, for us and for them, we give ourselves to insure that the strains of "Love Lifted Me" will never fade.

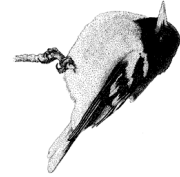
