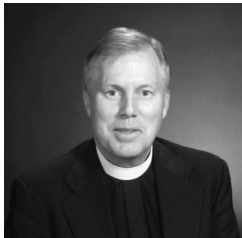

Dear Friends,

"Here is the church, here is the steeple, look inside and see all the people." As a little boy, this familiar hand game filled me with astonishment: that with a simple twisting of my small hands, as I was taught, something seemingly wondrous could appear.

Now, as I near the end of my ministry here at St. Mary's, and complete three decades of my vocation within the parish, I continue to be astounded that such a wondrous thing happens when we gather together in Jesus' name. It has been heartening, these past few months, to observe how many of you have come together in this time of transition to look forward to and embrace the future. In this short time, under the leadership of your Wardens and Vestry, a search committee has been formed, an Interim Priest, Bill Eddy, has been named, and by the end of this month, a Parish Profile will be completed, and you will be ready to discern who to call as your next rector. This is nothing short of remarkable, and all of you are to be commended for your commitment and cooperation! Next month, I will have more to say about what these seven years in our shared ministry has meant to me personally, but suffice it say now, that you are well on your way, in the words of Psalm 84, to going from "strength to strength" as this beloved community of faith.

Life goes on, and certainly our calendar this month reflects this. On Sunday, October 2nd, at the 10 a.m. service, we will be celebrating the Feast Day of St. Francis with our annual blessing of our pets. Please bring your companions to church that day tethered or in a crate for this special event. Our parish retreat will occur over Columbus Day Weekend and we are very fortunate to have with us the Rev. Matthew Martin to share his work with KidsCare, and international ministry addressing world hunger. On Sunday, October 17th, we will fete our great entourage of seniors, 80 years and older, at our Annual Silver Tea. On October 21nd and 22rd, our ECW holds its rummage sale. Please note that on Thursdays, October 13th, 20st, and 27th, we will offer a First Communion Class at 4:30 p.m. to all children in 2nd Grade or older. And throughout the month of October, there will be stewardship events described below, highlighted by our annual Harvest Dinner on Thursday, October 13th, with Brother Curtis Almquist from SSJE as our guest speaker. It is a pleasure to welcome Curtis to St. Mary's, as someone we have known for 25 years, and a special mentor to our son, Jamie, as he was growing up.

Looking forward to November, please remember to send to the office any names of loved ones you would like included in our necrology prayers on All Saints Sunday, November 7th. We will also observe our third Service of Healing for all veterans on Veterans Day, Friday, November 11th, at 10 a.m. in the church. And again, my last Sunday with you is on November 13th. On Sunday, November 20th, Bill Eddy will officially begin his ministry with you as your Interim Priest.

May God fill you with every blessing as we begin this new year as a parish!

Notes From the Garden:

These notes from the garden would be remiss if they did not start with enormous thanks to those members of the Garden Committee who have given so much of their time and effort to the maintenance of Saint Mary's Garden. As well, the groups of young men and women from the Barnstable Courts Program have been invaluable. They work with us about once a month and we simply could not do the *heavy lifting* without them.

Some things to note as you walk through the garden:

The gate that had been so badly rotted has been restored at the entrance to the Herb Garden. The fencing in the Herb Garden has been repaired and painted.

The Bridge between the Frog Pond and the Herb Garden has also been restored. Screws have replaced the nails in the floorboards so that we can keep the water flowing. The large Sugar Maple that was planted in memory of Jim Carlaw is now surrounded with grass and some white rhododendrons and azaleas. The challenge here is to keep the invasive materials out of the garden. On October 12, **475** daffodils will be planted in that area. Thanks to the ECW for their willingness to fund these new daffodils.

Our significant challenge is what to do with the narrow beds that stretch from the kitchen, across the front of the parish offices and down the side of the building. They are in need of total renovation; we will develop a plan and submit it to the Vestry for consideration in next year's budget.

A reminder that the Garden Committee would love to add new members; there are tasks, large and small. Please let me if you would be willing to help.

What a spectacular month to observe and enjoy God’s glory! From apple picking and walking in the woods to watching the bogs, moors and trees explode with color, there’s so much to see and do in the great outdoors this time of year.



There’s a lot going on at St. Mary’s, too... and in our community. This past Sunday, some of us joined with folks from the Hyannis area to experience **Common Cathedral** for the first time. We were led in worship by Father Steve, and it was just the beginning of what we hope will become a vibrant street ministry, taking place every Sunday on the South Street Green at 3:00 p.m. Come sing, pray and share in a communion service at an open table where all are welcome! The gardens will be alive with the sound of music on **Sunday, October 2nd** — music to the ears of pet lovers, that is. The annual **Blessing of the Animals** will take place that day. Whether they’re furry or feathered, slimy or scaly, God’s creatures great and small are welcome to attend church on this special Sunday. As a special treat, our gifted teachers will be telling the “St. Francis Story” in Godly Play.

On **Saturday, October 8th**, about 50 of us — adults, youth and children — will head up to the Barbara C Harris Camp in Greenfield, NH for our annual retreat. The focus of our program that weekend will be on Kids Care, and the packaging of nutritious, high-protein meals to bring back to our food-insecure population on Cape Cod. But there will also be plenty of time for fun and fellowship. Weather permitting, worship will be held outdoors on Sunday, in a glorious “tabernacle” of trees.

On **Friday night, October 28th**, St. Mary’s will be transformed into the spookiest place in town for the **Halloween Spook-tacular Lock-In**. Youth in grades 6-12 are invited to attend...IF they dare! There will be costumes, games, music, and of course, frighteningly delicious food. Please RSVP for this event, so I can get some idea of the skull (I mean) head count. :-)

On **Sunday, October 30th**, it’s the younger kids’ turn to enjoy some Halloween fun. The residents of the Pavilion in Hyannis are looking forward to greeting the children with warm smiles and tasty treats. 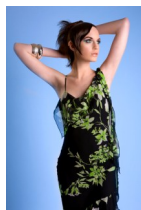

STEWARDSHIP at Saint Mary's Church, 2012

Dear Friends,

Please give a few moments thought to the following story. A couple were getting ready to go to the funeral for the son of friends. The young man had died in military service and his parents had given a stained glass window to their church in his memory. The woman said to her husband, "what are we going to give?" "What are you talking about?" her husband replied. "We don't need to give anything. Our son came back from Iraq alive." She quickly responded, "That is exactly what I meant. They lost a son and are giving a gift of thanks, a memorial to his life. We got our son back and we don't give anything?"

We all have so much to be grateful for. As the two of us grow older it becomes clearer and clearer that gratitude needs to be one of the centerpieces of our religious life. Stewardship 2012 at Saint Mary's is not so much about budgets, costs, salaries or programs. It is about cultivating an ever-deepening sense of gratitude to the God who has given us each so very much. At our best, a sense of gratitude to God should illumine every day we live.

Along with a wonderful group of fellow parishioners who serve with us on the Stewardship Committee, we hope to even more brightly illumine that kind of gratitude in the lives of every child and every adult in our parish family. Specifically: Since this past February a small and dedicated group from the greater Committee have held all of this in their daily prayers, remembering the Christian conviction that little of any real value ever occurs without prayer.

On *Stewardship Sunday*, October 16, our friend, The Rev. Bob Anthony will be our preacher, bringing his good insights to bear on Our Lord's sometimes confusing words, "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesars and to God what belongs to God." October 23, *Commitment Sunday*, we would ask that all parishioners, children, youth and adults, return their 2012 pledge cards during a special offering at all of our services. At that time our preacher will be Ron Bearse, our Junior Warden and faithful member of the Stewardship Committee. Ron's text, the Gospel lesson for that day, could not be more appropriate for *Commitment Sunday*; "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your strength."

There are any number of good reasons for each of us to support our parish church: we have property maintenance challenges; the education of our growing numbers of children is vital; providing fairly for our good staff cannot be dismissed; supporting the ministry of our Diocese has great value; as we search for a new Rector we want a financially stable parish; caring for those who suffer and are without can never be far from the thinking of any Christian yet may we let simple and pure gratitude to God for all that God has given us, may that be at the center of our giving, our sacrifices and our generosity.

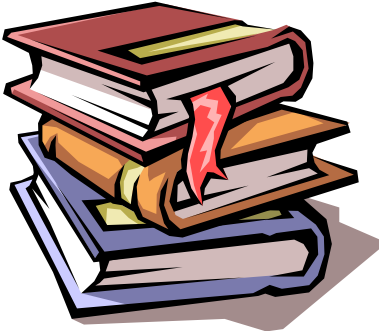
