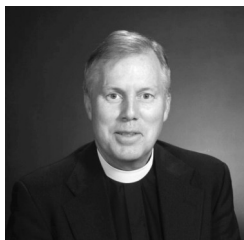

Dear Friends,

Nobel Laureate W.B. Yeats penned these words a century ago, but he could have been writing of the times in which we now live. Post 9/11 America has increasingly become a place where the center cannot hold, and we are driven to extremes. This seems especially true in the present election cycle, in which deep divisions in the body politic have widened with unprecedented vitriol and strife. The best in us seems to lack conviction, and the worst in us is full of passionate intensity. Anger, turned to rage, seems to consume everyone and everything.

In the midst of this turbulence, we, as Christians and Episcopalians, are called to hold to the center, I believe. And at St. Mary's, we do this in an intentional and concerted way. We are a community, we share a common cup, a common creed, a common hope.

We embrace one Lord, one faith, one baptism. Conflict and dissent, when it does and must come, is never the occasion for turning against others, and always the occasion for growing firmer and stronger in our resolve to be agents of reconciliation in our world.

This month, we claim this radical center in a number of ways in our parish. On Sunday, November 7th, we celebrate All Saints Sunday, when we join hands with all the faithfully departed, those we love but see no longer, to proclaim the unity that is at the heart of God's eternal kingdom. Please call in to the parish office those names of your loved ones you would like to have included in our necrology on that day. On Veterans Day, Thursday, November 11th, at 9:00 a.m., we invite everyone who has been touched and scarred by the perils of war to a special service of remembrance and healing at St. Mary's. On Thanksgiving Eve, November 24th, we gather together with our brothers and sisters of faith at the West Parish Church in West Barnstable at 7:30 p.m. for an ecumenical service of praise and thanksgiving. And on the First Sunday of Advent, November 28th, we begin a new year in our liturgical calendar with baptism and the reaffirmation of our common faith.

Friends, we belong to one body. This is a gift and grace of God. Let us, then, hold fast to the oneness we experience in Christ, and reclaim the center to which the love and light of Christ bids us all come.

From the Music Director

Sunday, November 21 is the last Sunday of the liturgical year, "The Last Sunday after Pentecost". It is also known as the Feast of Christ the King. On this day the adult choir will sing Franz Joseph Haydn's "Missa Brevis, Sancti Joannis de Deo" (Mass in Honor of St. John of God). This delightful work is perhaps one of the shortest masses in the Viennese tradition, but it contains much of the same beauty and majesty that are found in the larger Masses of Haydn, Mozart, and Schubert. This music will be a good offering before we enter the season of Advent on November 28, and thus, a new liturgical year.



Children's Choir: Children's Choir rehearsals have begun and are being held on Sunday mornings after the 10:00 AM service. Hall of Fame Adds Cape Cod League President Judy Scarafile to Women in Baseball Exhibit

-- 40 Years of Service Documented in Newest Incorporation of Female Pioneers --

(COOPERSTOWN, NY): The role of women in baseball is celebrated every day at the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum through "Diamond Dreams," a fan-favorite exhibit featuring nearly 100 artifacts and the stories of scores of women who have played influential roles on the field, in the office and in the stands throughout baseball history.

On Friday, October 15, a new face joined the exhibition walls, as the Museum revealed the incorporation of Judy Scarafile, long-time President of the Cape Cod Baseball League, to the "In the Office" segment of the exhibit, with an image and label documenting her achievements over 40 years of service to the game. Scarafile, who visited Cooperstown on Friday for the debut, joins other women executive pioneers in the exhibit, including Pam Gardner, President of Business Operations for the Houston Astros, and Major League Baseball executives Katy Feeney and Phyllis Merhige, in the panel of the exhibit.

For 40 years, Scarafile has served the 125-year-old Cape League in various capacities, leading the collegiate summer league organization since 1991 in all facets of business operations. In 2003, Scarafile became the first woman inducted into the Cape Cod Baseball League Hall of Fame and she has received numerous awards from charities and organizations, as well as winning the "Woman of the Year" Award from USA Baseball.

PRESS RELEASE FROM THE NATIONAL BASEBALL HALL OF FAME

Dorothy A. Savarese selected as one of "25 Women to Watch" in American banking for the second consecutive year.

For the second consecutive year, the editors of U.S. Banker and American Banker selected Dorothy A. Savarese as one of their "25 Women to Watch" in banking. She was recognized at a dinner October 6 at The Pierre Hotel in New York, where banking analyst Meredith Whitney was the keynote speaker.

Dorothy stated: "It is an honor to be recognized in this way, but it is also a reflection on the wonderful team at the Bank and their outstanding efforts. I'm fortunate to have the opportunity to represent the Cape Cod Five in this way."

Dorothy was profiled in the October issue of U.S. Banker.

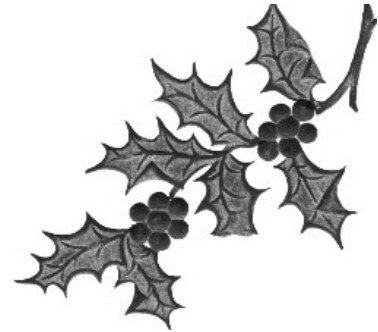

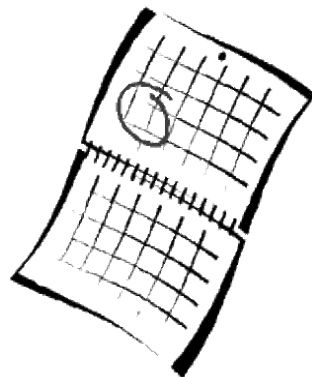
