(Save the Date: Sunday, June 14, 2015)

As I write this article on Patriot's Day, a contemporary version of Paul Revere's cry echoes in my mind! Thanks be to God, unlike the unwelcome arrival of the British forces launching the Revolutionary War, we are delighted to welcome our diocesan bishop, the Right Rev. Alan Gates to St. Mary's on Sunday June 14. Bishop Alan was consecrated last fall, only a few months after arriving in the Diocese of Massachusetts from Cleveland, Ohio where he had been serving as the rector of St. Paul's in Cleveland Heights. As bishop, +Alan is called to be the chief pastor of our diocese, and his immense compassion and caring were immediately summoned upon the death of his beloved predecessor, the Right Rev. Thomas Shaw in late October of last year. All throughout this exhausting and emotionally challenging year, Bishop Alan has been committed to listening deeply to the passions and needs of the diocese before launching any new initiatives. His sensitivity to Bishop Tom's legacy has been reverent and open to listening to where the Spirit is leading us, now.

Personally, it is a joy to welcome Bishop Alan to St. Mary's and to share with him the many ways that we have been seeking to connect more deeply with God, each other, and the needs of our community. In addition to being moved by +Alan's thoughtful answers and presentations during the Bishop search process, I have the privilege of working with him on the Commission on Ministry. In this context, I witness his faithful preservation of the rich traditions of our church while holding space for creativity, imagination, and humor. We are very blessed by his leadership and I hope you will save the date and be sure to join us as we welcome Bishop Alan on June 14.
